The Medieval World

Presenters: Dr. Helen Heineman, Dr. Greg Halfond and Dr. Erika Schneider

The Lifelong Learning Intersession Program, an integrated study of Western Civilization from the Ancient World to the present day, continues this January with Dr. Gregory Halfond, Historian, Dr. Erika Schneider, Art Historian, and Dr. Helen Heineman, English Professor. Through important presentations in the areas of history, art, and literature, these classes offer participants an opportunity to explore the origins and trace the developments of the culture and civilization we have inherited. This innovative multi-year approach provides a systematic examination of how the history, arts, and literature of Western Civilization emerged as inter-related aspects of a common human experience.

In January 2018, the subject will be the Medieval World, including cultural, social, and religious developments, artistic accomplishments, and literature of the period, presented in three weekly sessions, beginning January 16. The history and art sessions will explore the political, religious, cultural, and artistic diversity that characterized the period stretching from ca. 500 to 1500 CE. Examples of Romanesque and Gothic architecture and sculpture will be presented, as well as illuminated manuscripts. The literature sessions will feature several of Chaucer's *The Canterbury Tales*. For week one, participants should read the Prologue to *The Canterbury Tales* and "The Miller's Tale," using any edition of Chaucer in the original Middle-English.
