Student Testing in May and June

LVM requires us to assess our student's English levels at least once a year and, depending on when a new student is matched with a tutor, twice a year. In the past, scheduling the time to test students has been problematic so this year we would like to schedule the assessment administration through the tutor and not the student. You will get a google form sheet asking you when in May you are going to meet with your student and we will join either your in-person or online meeting to administer the test. We will be sending out more information toward the end of this month.
