<u>Professional Development Workshop (PDW) – Tuesday, January 23rd - The English Verb</u> <u>System - By Marcel L. 1:00-2:30pm - Costin Room - Framingham Public Library</u>

What is ChatGPT you ask? Well it is a free generative (i.e., new material) AI (i.e., artificial intelligence) chat (i.e., 2 people exchanging words). Because it is generative and creates new content it is not a search engine that finds existing material. How can it help you? Assume you are creating a lesson plan for your learner and you have a particular idea in mind but you have searched all favorite websites and Ellii and you just can't find what you are looking for. ChatGPT may be able to help you very quickly. Intrigued? This workshop will show you how to get started and how other tutors are using this tool now.
