Good to Know – To Share with Students

Preparation for Citizenship Exam – Civics and American History class

This is an 11-week seminar to help students prepare for the Naturalization Interview for US Citizenship. The class will include:

Review of material tested in the History and Civics, Reading and Writing sections of the interview

Practice interviews

Review of vocabulary and content in the Application for Naturalization (Form N-400)

The class will be on Thursday nights on Zoom from 7:00 PM to 9:00 PM and will start on April 13 and end on June 22. Students must speak English at the Intermediate level and must register for the class: fplmail4@minlib.net or 508 532 5574.
