#### REMINDER MIRA's 29th Annual Immigrants Day at the State House (IDSH)

This year, Immigrants Day will actually be a two-day event.

On **Tuesday, March 18th**, MIRA is running an all-day Immigrant Rights conference focused on preparing communities for action at the official IDSH on the 19th. Tickets to this conference are \$65 - Literacy Unlimited cannot cover the fee for volunteer attendees for this event, but if you are interested and able to afford it, we highly encourage you to attend.

On **Wednesday, March 19th**, all community members are welcome to gather in Boston for the free Immigrants Day at the State House program. Doors open at 9am followed by programming from 10-12, and a chance to meet with your legislators to discuss policy and issues from 12-2pm. <u>Tutor Workshop with Dr. Robin Danzak</u> – <u>Pronunciation 101: English Speech Sounds and Strategies for Students</u> Thursday March 27, 6-7:30pm - Framingham Public Library – Technology Learning Center (upper floor)

This workshop will overview English's phonemic inventory (speech sounds) and explore ways to teach the pronunciation of "tricky" sounds like "th" and "b vs. v". Tutors will learn and practice general strategies to support students' speech accuracy and fluency so that they have fun practicing and gain confidence to speak outside of class.
