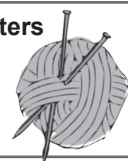

#### Annihilation by Jeff VanderMeer

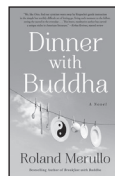
Wednesday August 8, 6-9:00pm – Main Library, Costin Room

PBS's POV Movie Series: The Workers Cup

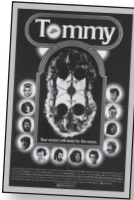
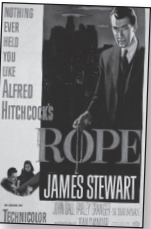
Friday August 17, 7-9:00pm – McAuliffe Branch, Community Room Doors open at 6:30pm.
