February 26, 7PM | Zoom

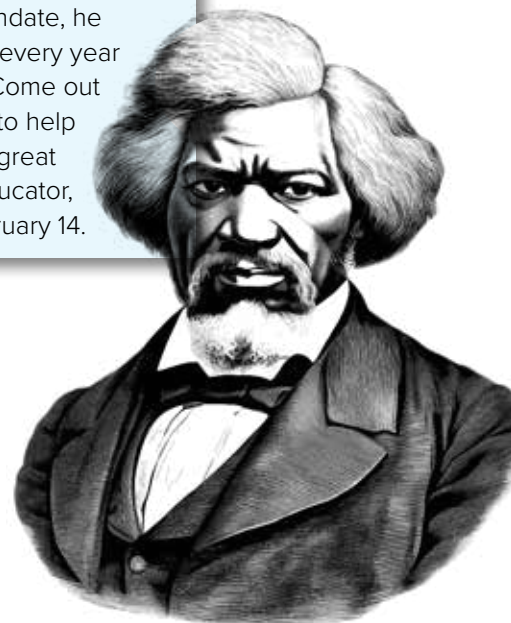

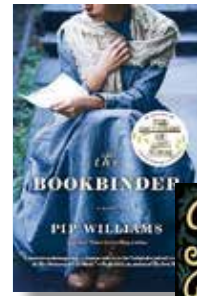
