Eighteen Additional Residents Test Positive, and 13 People have Recovered from the Virus

Health Department Releases Demographic COVID-19 Data;

May 26 Community Hour Focused on Education in Framingham Amid the Pandemic

- Eighteen additional residents test positive for the virus and 13 more have recovered: The number of people in the City who have tested positive for COVID-19 is now 1,582. With 766 cases recovered and 86 fatalities, Framingham currently has 730 active cases. The Framingham Health Department contacts the people who were potentially exposed and the owners of the businesses or places of employment where the potential exposures occurred to inform and counsel them on next steps (contact tracing). In addition to the active cases, the Framingham Health Department currently is following 216 residents in quarantine.

 information about confirmed cases by age, gender, race/ethnicity, fatalities, nursing homes,
