COVID-19 UPDATE

Since May 24, 17 Additional Residents Test Positive, 42 People have Recovered from the Virus, and City Learns of Two New COVID-19 Fatalities;

Reminder: Community Hour Focused on Education in Framingham Amid the Pandemic Today at 5 p.m.

- **Since May 24, 17 additional residents test positive for the virus, 42 more have recovered, and City learns of two new COVID-19 fatalities:** The number of people in the City who have tested positive for COVID-19 is now 1,610. With 835 cases recovered and 88 fatalities, Framingham currently has 687 active cases. The new fatalities are connected with nursing homes. The Framingham Health Department contacts the people who were potentially exposed and the owners of the businesses or places of employment where the potential exposures occurred to inform and counsel them on next steps (contact tracing). In addition to the active cases, the Framingham Health Department currently is following 199 residents in quarantine.
