Since Saturday, June 6, Four Additional Residents Test Positive, Seven People have Recovered, and City Learns of One New Fatality Related to COVID-19

Reminder: Community Hour focused on Shifting the Paradigm, Moving from Marches to Action Tuesday

- Since Saturday, June 6, four additional residents test positive for the virus, seven more have recovered, and the City learns of one new fatality related to COVID-19: The number of people in the City who have tested positive for COVID-19 is now 1,694. With 1,243 cases recovered and 97 fatalities, Framingham currently has 354 active cases. The Framingham Health Department contacts the people who were potentially exposed and the owners of the businesses or places of employment where the potential exposures occurred to inform and counsel them on next steps (contact tracing). In addition to the active cases, the Framingham Health Department currently is following 137 residents in quarantine.
