COVID-19 UPDATE

Two Residents Test Positive for COVID-19, and 13 People have Recovered, City Learns of One New Fatality;

Community Hour Tuesday, June 16: Continuing the Discussion – From Marches to Action – What is Next?

- **Two residents test positive for COVID-19, 13 more have recovered, and City learns of one new fatality:** The number of people in the City who have tested positive for COVID-19 is 1,700. With 1,332 cases recovered and 101 fatalities, Framingham currently has 267 active cases. The Framingham Health Department contacts the people who were potentially exposed and the owners of the businesses or places of employment where the potential exposures occurred to inform and counsel them on next steps (contact tracing). In addition to the active cases, the Framingham Health Department currently is following 126 residents in quarantine.
