October 3 – Race and Revolution

Guest Speaker: Dr. Maria Bollettino, Associate Professor, History, FSU

Enslaved people represented 20% of the population of British North America. The American Revolution established a new nation based on the principle that “all men are created equal,” yet slavery remained in place. This talk will explore the role of enslaved and free blacks in the American Revolutionary War and the legacies of the Revolution for race and slavery.

October 17 – The President and the Press: From Teddy Roosevelt to Donald Trump

Guest Speaker: Dr. David Smailes, Associate Professor, Political Science, FSU

Presidents have always had a complicated relationship with the press. We will explore that relationship, beginning with Theodore Roosevelt’s skillful use of the press and ending with current debates surrounding the fairness of political coverage and whether truly “objective” political reporting can take place.

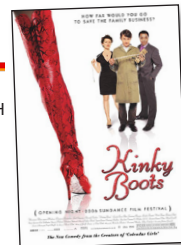


MCAULIFFE MATINEE: *Kinky Boots* (2006) 107 min.
