Children's Book Review

Eric vs. Everything

by Christina Uss Recommended for Grades 4-6.

Erik is a member of the Sheepflattener clan, proud descendants of Vikings, who choose and tattoo a motto for life on their arm when they grow up. Erik thinks his should be "Avoid Stuff" as he is afraid of everything: school, a ringing telephone, sports, any after school event his mother signs him up for. When he is sent with his sister Brunhilde (whose motto is "Conquer") to spend the summer with his wild cousins in Minnesota, Brunhilde decides that Erik, as a good Viking, should name and defeat his fears.
