

Dear Library Community,

Hoping that this latest (our 5<sup>th</sup>) online only edition of the Framingham Public Library's newsletter finds you and your family well. Since the moment the Library closed its doors due to the pandemic, staff have been working to keep as many Library services as possible available to you and your family. And over the past months we have continued to enhance, and expand your access to the Library's electronic resources. We hope you will explore the many on-line programs we have developed as you and your family look for informative and fun things to do safely from home. Throughout this newsletter you will find programs for all ages and interests. Please also see the Library's webpage www.framinghamlibrary.org/find-online for even more information. If you need assistance with any resources, Library staff are available for live Chat Monday through Friday 9am-5pm. Click on the Chat icon at the bottom right of the Library webpage. This past month we were also busy doing even more for our

City. Working with the City's Department of Public Health we repurposed our book drops to become collection points for donated homemade cloth facial coverings. Over 9,000 facial coverings have been processed and distributed to residents. Library staff held two pop-up distribution events in July where over 800 masks were made available to Framingham residents. And Library staff have been operating the City's Information Line (508-532-5411) providing answers to resident's questions on average of 75 times per day. We remain dedicated to do all that we can do, to assist you and our City during this crisis.

In early June we began curb-side delivery of library materials, and accepting return of the library materials you have had checked out since the closure. And in early July, in response to our patrons, we expanded this service to include evening and Saturday hours. Please check the Library's website to learn more about how this service happens, and happens safely. And you can also call us at 508-532-5570, Monday through Friday 9am-5pm and Saturday 9am-noon.

Beginning in early August, working in close consultation with the City's Departments of Public Health and Capital Projects & Facilities Management, we will be providing, by appointment, computer time to patrons needing access to the Internet. We have worked very carefully to be able to provide this essential service and to do so safely. If you are reading this, chances are good that you have access to the Internet. Many Framingham residents do not, and we understand that reaching out to them will be a challenge. You can help, by watching for forthcoming information on the Library's website and sharing with friends and acquaintances who would benefit from this service. We are eager to help! And we are faithfully following the safety procedures we all have to adhere to keep us all safe. Social Distancing, wearing Face Coverings at all times, and practicing hand washing and good hygiene. We are all in this together!



### Literature: The Business of a Woman's Life The Writings of Jane Austen, Charlotte Brontë, and Frances Trollope Monday August 10, 7-8pm – Online via Zoom

In 1836, when Charlotte Brontë sent Robert Southey, the Poet Laureate some of her poems, requesting his opinion, he replied: "Literature cannot be the business of a woman's life... The more she is engaged in her proper duties, the less leisure will she *have for it,*" strictly counseling her to give it up. Some years earlier, Jane Austen published her works anonymously. Charlotte, ignoring the Laureate's advice, published with a pseudonym. In her fifties, Frances Trollope added 'Mrs' to her name, perhaps to make herself more respectable. Later, Mary Anne Evans hid under the masculine name George Eliot. This talk will review the difficulties presented to the woman writer in the great age of the novel, and analyze their lives and works achieved within this context.

The virtual bookshelf lists all the titles you have borrowed or have placed on hold. You will get notified when a book on hold is available. \*Libby no longer offers email notification. It offers in-app or push notifications. However, if one goes to minuteman.overdrive.com they can sign up for email notifications there and get both email and in-app notifications from Libby *if they choose.*




