Hi everyone,

We are definitely moving into the next phase of this journey. More and more we are talking about how Literacy Unlimited and the libraries may function when "stay-at-home orders" are lifted. Although we may be able to meet face-to-face, we will be maintaining physical distancing and wearing masks. With that in mind, almost all meetings (e.g., tutor and student, conversation classes, tutor get-togethers, etc.) will probably continue to meet remotely in some capacity.

For almost 2 months, we have been sharing many ideas for continuing to tutor or lead conversation classes remotely through weekly tutor technology meetings, weekly tutor get-togethers, weekly Newsy emails, and person to person calls. Now seems a good time to slow down the information sharing and let you put some of these ideas into practice if you haven't already.

Tutor Meetings - On Tuesday we had 13 participants in our weekly **Tutor Technology meeting** and last night we had 12 participants at the **Tutor Get-together**. You can read about these meetings below in the Weekly Tutor Get-togethers section.

Tutor Hours for April – In addition to phone calls, texts, emails, and of course virtual conferencing time (e.g., Zoom, Skype, WhatsApp, etc.) with your student, please let us know how many hours you spent wrangling with technology (both you and with your student) and planning lessons with your student.

Testing: Because student testing cannot be administered in person or remotely, your students' May/June assessments have been put on hold until further notice.
