We were practicing social distancing standing at least 6 feet from each other. And we met yesterday via Zoom. 1. TIPs from Liehua from her family in China

Try your best to stay at home. Don't go outside, especially crowded places.

If you do go out, when you get home, please:

Take off your out coat, hanging near the door or on the deck. If you have 70% isopropyl alcohol, you can spray on your coat to kill the virus.

Take off your outside shoes, leave it near the door or on the deck.

Wash your hands with soap. If you are outside and no water, please use hand sanitizer. Gargle with salt water or mouth wash liquid to wash your mouth and throat.

Go for a walk, if outside is not crowded, but still remember the social distance. (In China, people can't do this, because there are so many people.)

Try use online shopping. After you receive the package, please leave it near the door for a while. If possible, use 70% isopropyl alcohol to spray it.
