Ideas for Connecting with Your Students

Here are some suggestions for connecting with your students.

Technology required: phone and email/snail mail OR a smart phone

Call or text your student and ask how they are doing. Find out if they need help (e.g., filing for unemployment, understanding the Covid-19 requirements, answering the census, etc.). If you need help answering their questions, contact us as we do have information on these questions.

Ask them if they would like to work on their English skills over the next couple of weeks. If yes, you can create your own stories, worksheets, writing prompts, etc. or download stories and/or

worksheets from the ESL library or NewsForYouOnline and send them to your student. You can either have them send the completed worksheets back to you or you can work on them together over the phone.
