Hi everyone,

Hello June and hello summer! Change is in the air and not only because of the season change, but also with the relaxation and removal of many pandemic restrictions. Many of us are experiencing things that we were not able to do last June or for the last 15 months. And not to be left out, Literacy is changing a few things too. Read on for what we are thinking and doing.

Literacy Re-opening

We know you are anxious to hear about when and how we will re-open. We have nothing definitive to report yet, but discussions with LVM are well underway. Although the Framingham Library is relaxing pandemic restrictions in line with Massachusetts, Literacy Unlimited is following guidelines set by Literacy Volunteers of Massachusetts and remains closed for in-person activities until further notice.

However, we think we may be able to hold an outdoor social event this summer. Stay tuned for some kind of outdoor event in August or September.

Changes to Recurring Tutor Meetings

Based on comments from tutors, we are changing the format of these meetings. Going forward they will be on Tuesday afternoons at 2:00 PM and will include both time to catch-up on what is going on with Literacy and other tutors (i.e., tutor office hours content) **AND** demonstrations and examples of how tutor's use technology in tutoring (i.e., tutor technology content). The Tuesday afternoon demonstration will repeat the following week at a Wednesday or Thursday night session. See times and schedules below.

Tutor Time (1) – Tuesday, June 8th at 2:00 PM

We will start the meeting with a brief overview of happenings at Literacy and check-in with tutors.

Then Laurie will show us how to use some of the Library's remote resources with your student. These options could be used by you in your tutoring sessions or could be used during the week by a student to practice their English. Topics could include getting a library card, using mango, borrowing e-books and magazines, virtual browsing, remote programming (e.g., Spanish Yoga class), etc.

If you have used Library resources with your student let us know. We would love to have you share with other tutors.

Tutor Time (1) REPEAT – Thursday, June 17 at 7:00 PM

We will repeat the Tutor Time (1) session described above. If you attend Tutor Time (1) on June 8^{th} there is no reason to attend this repeat session.

Tutor Time (2) – Tuesday, June 22th at 2:00 PM

We will start the meeting with a brief overview of happenings at Literacy and check-in with tutors.

Some tutors have expressed interest in an online forum for sharing expertise, experiences, resources, etc. with other tutors.

Laurie, Elyse, and Karen will demonstrate some options for a tutor forum. Our goal is to find a platform that is easy to use and access, allows tutors to interact with the site, and has some way of organizing the resources and notifying tutors intelligently of updates.

We will repeat the Tutor Time (2) session explained above. If you attend Tutor Time (2) on June 22^{nd} there is no reason to attend this repeat session.
